Qualifications

• 18 years or older • Provide documentation of experience working directly with school-age children in such areas as Sunday school, Scouts, sports, or babysitting. 460 hours+ needed. It is a plus if you have experience with STEM or Technology programming. Must be able to pass a background check from the TRAILS database, CBI and the FBI

Daily Responsibilities

- Group management, problem-solving, and conflict resolution.
- Deliver interactive and educational/artistic activities, youth development, academic enrichment and arts.
- Possess oral, auditory, and written communication skills appropriate for interacting with both children and adults.
- Implement the daily administrative, program related, and supervisory responsibilities.
- Adapt to changing circumstances.
- Under the direction of the Program Director, the Program Leader is responsible for delivering the program. (This includes behavior management and safety of the program participants.)
- The Program Leader will deliver professional customer service and relationship building skills to create a welcoming environment at CAP.
- Ensure that all supplies and equipment are well maintained.
- Assist the Program Director with providing effective communication to parents and developing a working relationship with parents.
- Ensure on-going cleanliness of all facilities used by the program.
- Act responsibly and be a positive role model for staff, parents and children.
- Follow and enforce all CAP procedures and policies, including: personnel guidelines, safety guidelines, facility access procedures, and program policies.
- Carry out emergency plans as necessary.
- The job requires the ability to stand for extended periods, kneel, reach, bend, and lift objects weighing in excess of 25 lbs.
- The noise level in the work environment may be moderate to high.
- Engage in active listening with program participants in order to build relationships, understand individual's goals and interests, and take the initiative to ensure the camper has a positive experience.

Details

Shifts vary between 7:30am and 5:30pm M-F. Part-time and full-time summer seasonal positions are available up to 40 hours a week. Staff training will take place May 28th-31st. Camp runs June 3rd through Aug 9th. No camp will be running the week of July 1st-July 5th.

This position pays \$18-20 an hour depending on experience. Discounted camp for children of employees and paid training.
