### **Qualifications**

• 21+ years or older • Provide verification letter detailing experience working directly with schoolage children in such areas as Sunday school, Scouts, sports, or babysitting. 460+ hours is needed. It is a plus if you have experience with STEM or Technology programming. Must be able to pass a background check from the TRAILS database, CBI, and the FBI.

Each Verification Letter must include the following:

- Ages of children worked or volunteered with
- Total number of hours worked directly with children
- Start and end dates of paid or volunteer work
- Duties performed
- Name, title, and contact information of person providing the Verification Letter
- Signature of the person providing the Verification Letter

### **Daily Responsibilities**

- Under the direction of the Camp Director, the Team Lead is responsible for overseeing and leading the daily activities of up to 45 elementary-aged campers.
- Possess oral, auditory, and written communication skills appropriate for interacting with both children and adults.
- Implement the daily administrative, program related, and supervisory responsibilities.
- Problem solve with confidence to resolve concerns quickly.
- Ensure that all supplies and equipment are well maintained, work with Camp Director to order new supplies when needed.
- Assist the Camp Director with providing effective communication to parents and developing a working relationship with parents.
- Administer first aid and medications as necessary.
- Ensure on-going cleanliness of all facilities used by the program.
- Act responsibly and be a positive role model for staff, parents, and children.
- Follow and enforce all CAP procedures and policies, including: personnel guidelines, safety guidelines, facility access procedures, and program policies.
- Carry out emergency plans as necessary.
- The job requires the ability to stand for extended periods, kneel, reach, bend, and lift objects weighing in excess of 25 lbs.
- The noise level in the work environment may be moderate to high.

### **Details**
